





## **WILMINGTON RECEIVES GRANT TO INSTALL WELCOME SIGN**



The City of Wilmington would like to thank Heritage Corridor Destinations Convention and Visitors Bureau for providing grant funds that will cover the cost of a new LED welcome sign at South Island Park. The sign is part of a new park project fronting Bridge Street (RT 66). This new park will be home to the Gemini Giant once he has had some repair work done at the Giant museum. The sign is scheduled to be installed by the end of June. The remainder of the project will commence this summer with plans to complete Phase I by the end of the summer and a new access road next summer.



### **Senior News You Can Use**

Don't be a victim...the top scams affecting seniors include:

- IRS/Department of Revenue Phone calls around tax season regarding a person committing tax fraud or owing back taxes and needing to transfer money before IRS seizes assets or garnishes wages.
- 2) **Tech Support Scams** Phone calls or emails advising your computer has been hacked and you need to purchase a tool or a service to clean your computer system
- 3) Relatives arrested/threatening you to be arrested Phone calls involving a relative or friend being arrested and needing money to post bail. Threatening they have incriminating evidence against you and will turn evidence over to police unless a sum of money is sent to someone to keep the evidence under wraps.
- 4) **Romance** developing a romantic relationship and slowly asking for money and monetary value increases as the duration of the "relationship" increases.

Our city periodically cleans sewer lines to ensure proper functionality and prevent blockages. This process involves using high-pressure jets to clean the sewer mains.

While this cleaning is crucial for maintaining the integrity of our sewer system, it can result in temporary sewer gas odors in nearby homes and businesses.

#### **Alleviating Sewer Gas Odors:**

If you detect a sewer gas odor in your home, we recommend the following steps

#### **Run Water in Fixtures -**

To address dry drain traps, run water in all fixtures (sinks, showers, toilets) for a few moments.

Additionally, pour a pitcher of water into each floor drain. This action refills the traps and creates a barrier to block sewer gas.

#### **CONSTRUCTION AHEAD**

The City of Wilmington received an award of \$2 Million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) grant funding last year for much needed infrastructure improvements in the downtown area.

The improvements will include storm sewer rehabilitation, manhole rehabilitation, sanitary sewer lining, and water main improvements on North Kankakee Street, North Main Street, and North Water Street. In addition, North Kankakee and North Main Streets will also be repaired and repaved.

Construction will begin no earlier than August of 2024 and completed by June of 2025. Intermittent daytime closure will be required as work progresses. All roads will be open to traffic at the close of each work day.
